

**NETHER WALLOP PARISH COUNCIL**  
**Extracts from the September meeting**

**Attendance:** Cllrs. Atkins, Hind, Richardson, Roach and Whitaker and four members of the public.

**Apologies:** Cllrs. Souter and Young and HCC Cllr. Woodhall and TVBC Cllr. Boulton.

**Standing Orders:** The draft updated Standing Orders were proposed by Cllr. Hind and seconded by Cllr. Roach with all in favour.

- Planning:** a) 08/01888 FULLN, erection of double garage, Orchard View, Heathman Street, the council raised an objection due to the fact that the garage would be very close to the road and the materials were not considered appropriate.
- b) 08/02116 FULLN, erection of detached dwelling, replacement sewage treatment plant, installation of oil tank, land at Tiarian, Salisbury Hill, no comment. However, the council recommended that the track leading to the house be upgraded once services had been installed.
- c) 08/02191/TREEN, fell ash trees, Fishing Cottage, Church Lane, no comment.

**Neighbourhood Watch:** Cllr. Whitaker reported that the school had been broken into during the summer and items stolen. Scrap metal and generators had also been stolen in the area as well as red diesel oil. A window in Over Wallop Church had been broken.

**Highways:** Cllr. Atkins reported that the gully at Jacks Bush, which had been flooded, should now have been dealt with. The footbridge at the Splash in Five Bells Lane will be resurfaced but Hants Highways do not think it is feasible to widen it due to its structure.

**Playing Fields:** Cllr. Richardson reported that two and a half football teams are playing. Youths had broken into the tennis court. The pavilion was being hired out for a second time for a party. The groundsman's fees have remained the same for the last seven years and it was proposed both Mr. Pasque and Mr. Cullen's were raised. Cllr. Hind reported that the council has agreed that Playground Services are to install the safety matting and the two springies and TVBC now need to approve this. Cllr. Hind produced a catalogue for those in attendance to see what had been chosen. A picnic table was also on order.

**New Village Hall Trust:** Cllr. Richardson said that yet again there was nothing to report.

**Village Green:** Cllr. Roach reported that as it was agreed when the lease was signed a peppercorn rent be been paid to both Mrs. Moulands as well as a bouquet of flowers given. From the £200 float given for maintenance to the Green various amounts had been paid out. The meadow needs to be cut and also the hedges. The Village Market and picnic was a great success and a collection made.

**Wallops Parish Hall:** Cllr. Whitaker reported that planning permission for the refurbishment of the Wallops Parish Hall has now been granted. The application has now gone in good time to the Lottery Fund.

**Correspondence:** Cllrs. Souter and Whitaker had attended a Quality Parish information evening recently and the council was not far off. The Clerk would look into this and was to attend a Clerks meeting at Twyford during the next week.

**Matters raised by councillors:** Mr. Lancaster of HARAHA has confirmed that the questionnaire for Affordable Housing will be distributed on Friday 26 September and asked whether the council wished to hand deliver or mail out. The council unanimously decided to have the questionnaires posted out. The Clerk to contact HARAHA to confirm this. The Salisbury Lane traffic survey had been done today.

**Points from the floor:** Mrs. Mongor had sent a message to say the hole at Bent Street had got worse (**Action: Cllr. Atkins**). Mrs. Lovell was concerned about mothers, possibly from the Playgroup walking along Farley Street. The possibility of another route would be investigated.

**Date of next meeting:** The next monthly meeting will be held on Monday 13 October 2008 at 7.30 p.m.
