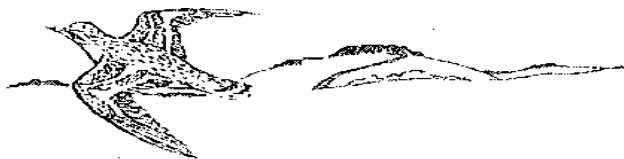

Wallop Artists painting afternoons will begin on **Monday 13 September** and will run until **Monday 29 November** from **2.00 - 4.30 pm** at St Peter's Church Hall, Over Wallop.

# Support Groups for Wallops Older Parishioners

---

## Counsel and Care

Do you know of an elderly person who needs extra help and support? Perhaps you yourself need advice or information to help you make decisions about support you may need in later life.

You are not alone. If you find the situation confusing or overwhelming you'll be glad to know that help is available.

The charity **Counsel and Care** has many years experience of helping people make sense of what they're entitled to and making sure that older people can access the best quality care and support possible. The following anonymous quote from one of their callers illustrates how helpful their advice line can be:

"I contacted Counsel and Care about my mother who had been in a care home for the last seven years. She had paid for all her care herself during that time and, as a result her money was running out. I was really concerned that my mother would have to move to another cheaper care home to cut the costs. The advice worker immediately advised me to make sure my mother had a needs assessment carried out by her local council straightaway as

the council should have become responsible for paying her care home fees when her savings ran down to £23,250... I particularly appreciated the time you took to listen to my case and the details and professional response."

Counsel and Care is the national charity working with older people, their families and carers to get the best care and support. Their advice line is on hand to offer expert advice. The number you need is **0845 300 7585** where you can book a telephone appointment to speak to a friendly and expert adviser at only the cost of a local rate call from most landlines.

However complicated your issue may be you can rest assured that **Counsel and Care's** advice will be well researched and informative. When relevant, they will send you guides from our range of over 60 expertly written publications. These are all available free of charge in print or from their website. ## Age Concern

You may not know that your local Age Concern is Andover and District. We are a small charity with not very many paid staff hours and a lot of volunteer input. In fact our volunteers are an essential part of our services.

We offer information and advice every weekday morning from our office in **Town Mill House, Bridge Street, Andover SP10 1BL** (by phone **01264 354425** or to visitors that call in). We can help with queries and concerns on a range of issues such as utility bills, transport, care support, legal worries, bereavement and local amenities. We also provide home visitors for form filling (often attendance allowance), and offer expert welfare benefits and pensions advice, foot clinics, a Sunday lunch and Tuesday club, occasional social events, and help represent older people's views locally.

We are keen that rural residents in the north Test Valley know that we are here, for advice and support. We are looking to create more links with our local villages and rural residents, so that we can spread useful information more widely and get feedback on issues relating to older local people's needs. We may also be

able to support new activities and groups that benefit the community. We hope that local people (of any age!) would be interested in being one of our Local Links with their village. An "ideas" lecture series will start at 8pm in Broughton Village Hall on **September 22nd with "The English Language in Hampshire", By Professor Christopher Mulvey.**

*The English of Wessex was called West Saxon; today, we call it West Country English. It was the language of King Alfred, and since Alfred's time, Hampshire's West Saxon has become a rural dialect. Meanwhile, London dialects have provided the basis for various forms of English to be heard in the modern county. In addition, the arrival of English-speaking immigrant groups from Asia has provided further new urban dialects. Nonetheless, had Winchester remained the capital of England, the Queen would be speaking Tess Durbeyfield's English.* Christopher Mulvey is Emeritus Professor of English at the University of Winchester. He has taught in Universities in the USA and UK, written extensively, lectures world-wide, and is Managing Editor of the Winchester University Press. He is a trustee of the English Project, a registered charity that aims to open a permanent English Language Exhibition in Winchester in 2014.

# THE de WALLOP FAMILY

---

Judy Maynard describes the lineage of the Wallop family in Over Wallop.

The history of the de Wallop family can be traced back to Richard de Wallop who, in 1086, was granted The Manor of Wallop in the west of Over Wallop. About 120 years later, Alice de Wallop, the heiress to both the name and the Over Wallop estate, married Peter de Barton of West Barton, Hampshire whose grandson, Richard, took the name of de Wallop rather than de Barton. His great-grandson, John Wallop, bought the estate of Farley Mortimer near Basingstoke in the mid 1400s as the family home, but by the mid 1500s it had been re-named as Farleigh Wallop by Sir Henry Wallop who also bought the small manor of Over Wallop Buckland. His grandson, Robert Wallop, bought the third part of Over Wallop, Wallop Moyles, sometime before being accused of treason by King Charles II and imprisoned in the Tower of London until his death five years later in 1667. The actual sites of the three manor houses, if they ever existed, remain unclear to this day. John Wallop 1690-1762 was created Baron Wallop of Farleigh and also Viscount Lymington in 1720, and later, 1<sup>st</sup> Earl of Portsmouth in 1743 which became the main title. All three titles are still extant.

Newton Wallop 4<sup>th</sup> Earl of Portsmouth took the family name of Fellowes when he inherited Eggesford House from his uncle, but his son, Isaac Newton Fellowes 5<sup>th</sup> Earl, resumed the name Wallop. One of Isaac's daughters, Lady Rosamond Alicia Wallop, married Augustus Langham Christie of Glyndebourne in 1882, and two of the restaurants at Glyndebourne Theatre in Sussex are now named Over and Nether Wallop. Her youngest sister, Lady Henrietta Anna Wallop, married John Carbery Evans, a solicitor, and lived at Townsend Manor in Over Wallop in 1890 thus forging a physical link again with Over Wallop which continued until 1988 when, there being no direct heirs; Townsend was left to The National Trust, who sold it as a private house.

Oliver Henry Wallop 8<sup>th</sup> Earl was the younger brother of John Fellowes Wallop 7<sup>th</sup> Earl and not expecting to inherit the title he went to the U.S.A. to farm. His son, Gerard Vernon Wallop 9<sup>th</sup> Earl, returned to England to be educated at Winchester and Oxford and farmed the family estate at Farleigh Wallop until he emigrated to Kenya in 1953 where he bought two farms at Kitale on the slopes of Mt Elgon on the Uganda border, one of which he named Over Wallop. He returned to England in 1984. Farleigh School, a Roman Catholic Preparatory School, was founded at Farleigh Wallop House where it stayed for the thirty years that the Portsmouths were abroad and was then re-located to the present site at Red Rice.

In about 1933 the Over Wallop lands and houses, with the exception of Townsend Manor, were sold, mainly to the tenants, thus ending 847 years of the de Wallop family ownership of Over Wallop.

## Addendum

The verb 'to wallop' meaning 'to hit hard' was said to have gained an alternative meaning due to the exploits of Sir John Wallop 1490-1551, a soldier and diplomat, who became famous when he set fire to twenty one French towns in the name of King Henry VIII as reprisal for the burning of Brighton. This so impressed everyone that 'to wallop' soon became popular in the sense of 'to inflict a heavy defeat', a description which is in frequent use today. Another meaning of the word became associated with strong beer in the sense that it 'packs a punch'. Who knows - perhaps Wallop beer was particularly potent!

(Further background to the history of the Wallops will be found in the forthcoming book 'Behind the Scenes in Nether Wallop.)

## **DO YOU NEED BETTER BROADBAND?**

The views of broadband users across Test Valley are being sought for a survey to measure the level of demand for a better broadband service.

Test Valley Borough Council and the eHampshire Partnership have produced a short survey for Test Valley residents and businesses. It asks for details of current internet speeds and seeks views on what residents would pay for faster access to the World Wide Web.

Cllr Peter Giddings, the Economic Portfolio Holder for Test Valley Borough Council said "It is important to make internet access better for everyone but we need to make sure that there is demand for the service. With more people working from home in rural areas, faster broadband access is essential to keeping the local economy moving".

The results of the survey will be mapped, and overlaid onto an existing map of not-spots - a term used to describe areas with very poor broadband access. This will identify the areas which require higher speed broadband access. The evidence that has been gathered will then be used to lobby internet service and infrastructure providers, to enable a better broadband service for Test Valley.

Glenn Peacey, eHampshire Manager, encourages all Test Valley residents and businesses to take part: "This survey has already been undertaken in Winchester, where we have worked in conjunction with BT Openreach to provide better broadband infrastructure for residents. The Test Valley survey results are a vital tool for us to demonstrate to providers that there is a demand for better broadband in rural areas."

## **Have you been offered a security survey for your home recently?**

It has come to the attention of Hampshire Trading Standards Service that a security company are currently telephoning residents offering to come out and survey properties for security purposes, i.e. burglar and smoke alarms.

It has been suggested that this company use high pressure sales and may offer the equipment for £1 but only if customers sign up to a costly monitoring agreement.

Please be on your guard about these types of cold callers either over the telephone or on your doorstep. If you have already arranged for a visit by a salesman and/or require any assistance concerning this or similar cold calling matters please do not hesitate to contact our **Quick Response Team on 01962 833666**

# OVER WALLOP PARISH COUNCIL

Extracts from the meeting on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2010

---

**Present:** Cllrs. Murray-Twinn, Burden, Cochran, Bird; Borough Cllr. T. Hope; Parish Clerk R Waterman; Members of the Public - Mr T Macey, Mr C Hammond  
**SALISBURY LANE TRAFFIC ISSUES.**

The Chairman reported that she has received many emails some from residents of Nether Wallop Parish. These will be directed to NW Parish Council. The Chairman suggested a Public Meeting in September with representatives from both OWPC and NWPC. Andrew Gibson, Chairman of HATS and County Council representative to be asked to chair the meeting. OWPC supported this idea. Borough Councillor Hope reported that Hampshire County Council has sought funding to do a feasibility study to find the best solution; however no finance is available for 'C' roads. Cllr Hope reported that Ray Alborough and Team are employed by Hampshire County Council and represent the County at Test Valley Borough Council. Cllr Mr Hope suggested that a temporary closure of Salisbury with detailed monitoring of the traffic through the village during the trial closure. Mr Hammond stated that the Traffic Group would like Salisbury Lane closed to through traffic or a traffic calming scheme. Moving the traffic problem to another area of the village must be avoided. Mr Hammond reported results of the last traffic movement survey during the last closure of Salisbury Lane: Southern end of Station Rd 1720 cars per day. Middle 1,933; north end 1,750. The extra 200 cars a day around the War Memorial most likely due to local resident movements. Despite, the traffic volume being similar, Northern end gets Salisbury Lane commuter traffic, and Southern end gets extra local traffic driving to the A343. Further traffic issues including the School Travel Plan, flashing lights and a Lollipop person on the A343 were discussed. Mr Macey reported his concern that his son must negotiate the traffic in Salisbury Lane and then cross the A343 every day to catch the school bus.
